

We've long been famous for our iconic houseboat holidays and paddle steamer history, but there's more on offer.

Our waterways begin in the lower Murray near Swan Reach. This stretch boasts some of the river's widest expanses and most spectacular ochre cliff faces. Not to mention, we're home to Australia's first dark sky reserve – the <u>River Murray</u> <u>International Dark Sky Reserve</u>.

From here, we follow the Mighty Murray Way towards Mannum and Murray Bridge, two of our larger river towns. Both have large riverfront recreation areas with restaurants. These idyllic spots are home to major events and people soaking up river life.

In Murray Bridge you can host a function at <u>Bridges Event Centre</u>, stay at the six-storey <u>Bridgeport</u> <u>Hotel</u> overlooking the riverfront and iconic bridges and take a quick trip out of town to Monarto Safari Park.

South towards the Lower Lakes is the Murray Mouth and Coorong – one of the most unique environments in the world – made famous again by the 2019 film remake of *Storm Boy*.

Along the way, you'll go through Tailem Bend, now firmly on the map thanks to <u>The Bend Motorsport Park</u>.

Further south, you'll start catching glimpses of Lake Albert and Lake Alexandrina, as they begin to open up to the Coorong National Park. The lakeside town of Meningie is set right on Lake Albert and known for spectacular sunsets and fresh seafood.

On the other side of the Coorong, you can travel through Lake Alexandrina towns (such as Milang, Clayton and Langhorne Creek) on your way to Goolwa, where the Murray meets the sea.

Family adventures are our thing. So, whether it's a quick day trip from Adelaide, or an extended getaway with friends in a riverfront holiday home, we think this might just be the perfect place for you. Whether it's an up-close wildlife experience at <u>Monarto Safari Park</u> or the chance to roll down a sandhill in the <u>Coorong</u> <u>National Park</u>, we have something to suit all ages. Things to add to your itinerary include fishing or paddling along the River, a visit to <u>Karoonda's new space-themed</u> <u>playground</u> featuring a 10m, three-level tower, custom-built moon Lunar Rover, water play space and more.

The interactive display at the Mannum Dock Museum is

always a hit with kids. Your little ones can become the 'captain' and steer the wheel, blow whistles and talk through brass funnels.

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Karoonda playground



Our flat terrain and mild winters, mean our trails (on and off water) are accessible all year round.

So - whether you're an avid paddler, runner, walker or cyclist - you've got places to break a sweat here, no matter the season. Even <u>Monarto Safari Park</u> has extensive trails, meaning you can have some seriously up-close encounters with the wild on foot.

Our biggest, is the 325km Lavender Federation Trail, a favourite amongst bushwalkers. It starts in Murray Bridge and winds through diverse countryside, with a highlight being Kinchina Conservation Park, just outside of Murray Bridge.

The Mannum Waterfalls are also a great hike for the whole family.

Paddle and explore

The Lower Murray Canoe Trail was launched in 2019 and is gaining momentum from Australia's paddle community. Created to give people an up-close experience with the Lower Murray ecosystems, it offers options for beginner to advanced paddlers. The Mannum Canoe Trail has a history focus, as it shows you a view of the historic PS Marion and <u>Mannum Dock</u> <u>Museum</u> from the water.

Or, if you're after a guided tour to some of our most pristine parts of the Coorong (many only accessible by kayak), then Canoe the Coorong is for you. This team can host all ages and abilities. Or hire your own vessel – our local Visitor Information Centres can get you sorted.

Love stand up paddleboarding?

The Lower Lakes are shallow and great for any style of paddling (or on the blowy days, they're popular for wind and kite-surfing). If you're a morning person, we'd recommend an early start for the ultimate sunrise experience.

Kayaking on the Coorong

Peddle power

The Encounter Bikeway begins along the Murray River in Goolwa and takes you along the river's edge to the barrage. You'll pedal under the Hindmarsh Bridge and through the

You can have some seriously up-close encounters with the wild, without the crowds. wharf precinct. Renowned for its cycling culture, Goolwa cafés will welcome cyclists.

The 300km Murray to Clare Trail takes you on a scenic route via Monarto on dirt roads and tracks. *Please note the trail is not sign-posted, so plan your trip ahead.*

Anything goes

Some parts of the 450km Murray Coorong Trail are open. This walking and mountain bike trail offers incredible views of the river, Lower Lakes and Coorong. Sections of between 2 - 20km will take you along various surfaces, across the ferry at Mannum, through pine forests near Tailem Bend, along Sturt Reserve in Murray Bridge and from Meningie to the Coorong's edge.

Shorter trails include the Tailem Bend History Trail or Murray Bridge Discovery Trail. For riverside views and native wildlife, try the Pelican Path in Meningie, Swanport and <u>Rocky Gully Wetlands</u> in Murray Bridge, or the Goolwa Barrage walk to the Murray Mouth. ■

If you prefer evening adventures, you'll love the relaxed Gold Stars Sunset Dinner experience with <u>Juggle House</u> <u>Experiences</u>, touring the <u>River Murray</u> <u>International Dark Sky Reserve</u>.

If you love fresh produce, make sure you drop in to <u>Woodlane Orchard's</u> new produce shop and café at Mypolonga and take home a bag of fresh honey, dried citrus, award-winning olive oil and other treats.

> And if fresh food and fine wine is your thing, then you have to spend a day or two in the <u>Langhorne Creek Wine</u> Region. The 8 unique local cellar doors have a taste of everything, but you can't go past a visit to the recently expanded <u>Bremerton</u> <u>Wines</u> – offering delicious food,

wine and gin flights, and the perfect grassed outdoor space to relax with a group.

Nearby here is the <u>Kimbolton Wines</u>, which has some of SA's best rosé – and you can sip on a glass while you take in the cool architecture of its cellar door made from shipping containers (you need to see it to believe it). While you're here, cruise amongst <u>Coorong National Park's</u> trails to <u>Salt Creek</u>, or along the beach from <u>Goolwa</u> to the <u>Murray Mouth</u>.

For adrenaline junkies, we recommend a visit to <u>The Bend Motorsport Park</u> for karting, hot laps and off-road adventures.

Plus, if racing is your thing, then time your trip around the next Murray Bridge Racing Club meet, and spend the day dressed up at <u>Bridges Event Centre</u>.

If you need a place to stay, then check-in with the team from <u>River</u>. <u>Shack Rentals</u> or the new 6-storey <u>Bridgeport Hotel</u>. Or if you want to float along the Murray, try the <u>Unforgettable Houseboats</u> fleet or <u>Houseboat Hirers Association</u>.



> up paddleboards, tinnies, and speedboats – so you can make the most of the water. A few extra toys on board allows you to head out for a paddle on sunset, or into the backwaters and drop a line.

Some of the vessels or accommodation along the river will throw this equipment in as part of your package, however if you need extras, try Freedom Boat Hire, Canoe the Coorong or Lake Albert Paddle Boards (Meningie).



Coorong National Park

Feed a lion, meet a Coorong pelican, learn how to fillet fish, or set up camp for one of the greatest views to the stars in the world.

Whatever wild adventure your heart craves, our region will have something to try during your next trip. Our spectacular waterways, dark skies and unique land are some of our greatest assets.

Our backyard is the perfect place to switch off the phone and immerse yourself in nature. So whether it's the morning sunrise across the Murray, sunset over the Lakes, or twinkling stars over the Mid Murray, you'll want to stop in our backyard.

Switch off, and get back to nature

Camping, bushwalking, *Civ* mountain biking, fishing, fourwheel-driving and kayaking all work together here. Every day we see 4WDs loaded up for an off-road adventure.

Start at the freshwater end, camping along the banks of Swan Reach or Walker Flat, before you head along the Mighty Murray Way towards campsites at Mannum and Murray Bridge. From here, you can explore the Lower Lakes and Coorong for a saltier experience and feel a million miles away from civilisation. If you love fishing, try for a giant mulloway or even a fresh callop without having to board a boat! A must for seafood lovers is the <u>Coorong Wildside Tours</u> experience. Coorong mullet has become pretty famous down this way, and tour operators Tracey and Glen will take you on a close-up experience in their new custom-made touring and fishing boat.

Twitch, twitch

Explore the Lower Lakes and Coorong for a saltier experience and feel a million miles away from civilisation. Twitchers love the region for its incredible variety of birdlife and conservation areas. Of course the gem of the region is the Jack's Point Pelican Observatory down near Salt Creek, but there is much more. Just recently, the almost-

extinct Mallee Emu Wren was released back in to Ngarkat Conservation Park near Tintinara, and near Tailem Bend you'll find plenty of unique native birds at the volunteer-run Pangarinda Botanic Garden.

At the other end of our region, we have the Lower Murray backwaters and lagoons which are home to a variety of ducks, herons and bitterns. Places to view these birds include hides at Mannum (Hermann Gass Reserve), Goolwa and Murray Bridge (Riverglades and Swanport Wetlands).

Giraffe Safari experience



This region is packed full of exciting stops, but how do you fit them all in to one trip? Fear not - this guide will direct you to all the local hidden gems.

The Round House, Murray Bridge

Swan Reach

Starting in Swan Reach, you can grab a bite to eat at the crowd favourite, <u>Swan</u> <u>Reach Hotel</u>. You'll need the fuel of a quality pub feed to get through the rest of the itinerary – so tuck in!

We recommend staying the night at Swan Reach to see the breathtaking <u>River Murray Dark Sky Reserve</u>. It's the first of its kind in Australia and only the 16th in the world, so you won't want to skip it. Its dry climate and cloudless skies result in a once in a lifetime view of the night sky. For a culturally enriching experience, book ahead for a guided tour of the <u>Ngaut Ngaut Conversation Park</u>, located between Swan Reach and Nildottie. The traditional owners will fill you in on the history and stories of this area, providing an understanding of the local Nganguraku people.

Karoonda

Why not take the longer route to Murray Bridge, a detour to <u>Karoonda</u> here will be well worth the trip. The large scale award-winning silos art, including a night time illumination show, has brought them global attention –

but don't worry you can't miss it. There's also a great new space-themed playground for kids nearby if you have the little ones with you.

Otherwise, if you're more interested in the deep history of Karoonda you should drop into Pioneer Park – their major historical attraction.





Bowhill General Store

Bowhill

From Swan Reach or Karoonda, you can follow the <u>Mighty Murray Way</u> down to Bowhill where you can stop for a coffee with a view. The <u>Bowhill General Store</u> has earned itself an impressive status for its recent renovation. This modern beauty has been attracting audiences from near and far who come to sit in the outdoor dining area and look out over the cliff face, onto the glassy Murray River below.

In the warmer days you'll find yourself watching the water-skiers whiz past showing off their best moves, or one of the local paddlesteamers elegantly cruising past with a crowd on board. To make the most of your visit and relax, you'll find some quiet places to stay right on the river at nearby Younghusband – or why not stay right on the water in a houseboat at Kia Marina?

Mannum

After you've passed through Younghusband, you'll come to the dualferry crossing at Mannum (which is a great way to view the river). Mannum is the home of <u>PS Marion</u> and <u>PS</u> <u>Mayflower</u>. Both of these beautifully restored paddle steamers allow you to experience the nostalgia of historic river maritime experiences.

Plus, if you like to hike, then you'll love Mannum Waterfalls. This popular bush walking destination, with moderate to steep walking tracks, follows along Reedy Creek right up to the falls.

Murray Bridge


Driving 25 minutes south from Mannum will land you in Murray Bridge, the heart of our region.

A quick walk into the town will greet you with a wide variety of shops and cafés. Or to take in the local history, spend time at the restored <u>Round House</u>, overlooking the twin bridges and offering a 180 degree panoramic view of the Murray River. Here you can take a history tour (bookings essential), or just wander around the beautifully manicured gardens yourself – it's open to the public all year round.

Across the road from the Round House you'll find the <u>Bridgeport Hotel</u>, (and trust us, you can't miss it!). You'll be able to spot it from almost anywhere in Murray Bridge, especially if it has its neon blue lights on. The modern interior will knock your socks off, so head inside and see it for yourself (or stay the night and wake up with river views, a gourmet breakfast and barista-made coffee). >

Point Malcolm Lighthouse, Narrung

If you have time, it's worth taking a walk across the pedestrian path of the historic Murray Bridge. On the town side, extend your stroll down to Sturt Reserve where you'll pass the newly upgraded rowing club, iconic riverfront views and the dreaded Bunyip.

For those who want more, keep following the tracks through wetlands to Long Island Reserve, or extend your trip with a visit to the Swanport Wetlands where you can stroll along boardwalks or watch the birds from custom-built viewing hides.

It's always worth adding Monarto Safari Park to your itinerary too (and if you're travelling from Adelaide, you can add it to the start or end of your trip as it sits along the South Eastern Freeway).

Tailem Bend

From Murray Bridge, a small 15 minute venture south east will land you in the centre of Tailem Bend.

This country town has put itself on the map with its world-class The Bend Motorsport Park. Between their impressive race circuit, rally and offroad tracks, 4WD adventure park and karting course, you'll easily spend a an adrenalin-fuelled day out. It's also got a bar and restaurant, plus showroom of some of the world's most incredible cars on display for you to get up close with.

Once again, you can stay the night here in the <u>Rydges Pit Lane Hotel</u>, or nearby at The Bend's own Big 4 Holiday Park.

If motorsport isn't your thing, you could always pop into Regional Profile <u>Cutters</u> to personalise your own memorabilia. This family business are local artists, and will create metal keepsakes and designs for you to take home and display indoors or out.

From here, you'll have two options to either cross the Wellington Ferry or keep driving south, down the east side of the Murray River.

Meningie

If you choose not to cross, you'll be led down by the Princes Highway to where the river flows into Lake Albert. In the gorgeous lakeside town of Meningie, you can step out onto the jetty and get a close-up view of this magnificent scenery. And if you have the time, why not finish your trip a little further down south in the Coorong National Park. If you're in a 4WD, you can explore the tracks amongst the Coorong - or head inland to Ngarkat Conservation Park and drive the renowned border track. When driving between these two beautiful parks - make sure you drop in to visit the famed Coonalpyn silo art, and even spend a night at Tintinara's newly renovated Motel on Becker.

Langhorne Creek

If you choose to cross the ferry at Wellington, you'll be following the road along the edge of Lake Alexandrina and on to the Langhorne Creek Wine Region.



Goolwa When Precinct

Here, you'll want

to ensure a stop at <u>Kimbolton Wines</u> (with its incredible rooftop deck, refreshing rose, cheese tasting plates and brilliant hospitality. Just down the road, Bremerton has just expanded its cellar door - so there's plenty of space to play, eat and drink - and you should definitely try their new small batch gin flavours with a flight out on the lawns. Other wineries to visit include Lake Breeze, Bleasdale, Angas Plains, Vineyard Road, The Winehouse and Rusticana.

Goolwa

If you're following the Murray River, your trip will finish in Goolwa, the home of the Murray Mouth. If you happen to arrive on the first and third Sunday of the month - the Goolwa Wharf Markets should be your first stop.

This beautiful riverside town is also home to the award-winning biennial South Australian Wooden Boat Festival - plus the much-loved Cockle Train. If you love river history, or just want to experience something new - take a trip on the <u>PS Oscar W</u>. Otherwise, finish your trip with a quick adventure over the bridge to Hindmarsh Island. Here you can spend time at the marina hotel, or head out to Sugars Beach to see close up, where the river meets the sea at the Murray Mouth.

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



Keep a look out for Mannum's new vodka distillery - <u>Roylancer</u> <u>Distillery Co</u>, which is set to open its doors early 2022 in a historic Randall Street building. Roylancer uses grain from local farmers and supports small business complete with a selection of local produce on the shelves.

Further down river, in the beautiful country town of Mypolonga you'll find some of the best fresh fruit of anywhere in the world. The climate, soils and passionate people here lend themselves to creating beautiful tastes – and these are available as you pass though.

One stop is <u>Woodlane Orchard</u>, where founder Kelly concocts magnificent meals, bite-sized delights and everything else she can create from the Mypolonga food bowl. While she specialises in dehydrated fruits and nutritious hand-made ready meals – she also serves up a mean ginger gin punch and other cocktail garnishes. Woodlane Orchard will be opening its own boutique coffee shop food store and local produce market in 2022

Further down river, in the beautiful country town of Mypolonga you'll find some of the best fresh fruit of anywhere in the world. - so keep an eye out when you pass by. Whether you want escape into a secluded campsite, or enjoy the comfort of a well-appointed caravan park, our region has it all.

You can find campsites and caravan parks close to our popular townships with easy access to shops, restaurants, and facilities, while others are in natural bush settings with water frontage and a full range of recreational activities near by.

Caravan Parks

The BIG4 Breeze Holiday Park in Mannum has a good mix of riverfront sites (powered and un-powered), villas and cabins. It's in the heart of the town, next door to the iconic twin ferry crossings and a short stroll from a range of cafés, pubs, bakeries, shopping, the Mannum Dock Museum and more.

Murray Bridge has three caravan parks spread throughout the town.

The Avoca Dell Caravan Park and Murray Bridge Marina Camping and Caravan Park provide close access to the river and boat ramps. On the edge of town there's the <u>Murray Bridge Tourist Park</u> which has architecturally designed selfcontained accommodation.

In Tailem Bend, families love the new BIG4 The Bend Holiday Park. It's only 700m from the world-class Motorsport

Park and offers a range of accommodation types as well an outdoor heated pool, playground, jumping pillow, large recreational areas and modern amenities and facilities.

Meningie's Lake Albert Caravan Park has some of the most picturesque views and friendly, countryside atmosphere - and it's conveniently by the town centre, making

for a great base to explore this side of the region.

Karoonda Tourist Park offers Jayco cabins and 8 powered and unpowered sites positioned beside large lawns, big gumtrees and BBQ facilities. It's the perfect place to stop on your road trip and catch the town's iconic silo art during the day and projections at night.

Others include the Punyelroo Caravan Park, Clayton Bay Riverside Holiday Park, Discovery Parks Goolwa, Wellington Caravan Park, Pinnaroo Caravan Park, Westbrook Park and the River's Edge Caravan Park in Tailem Bend.

Campgrounds

Some towns offer free or low-cost camping at reserves with basic facilities so you can enjoy the camping experience while still enjoying some creature comforts.

Of course, there's the rugged Coorong National Park and Salt Creek where you can brave the elements along remote stretches of lagoons and sand dunes with native wildlife at all corners. 4WDing, fishing, boating and birdwatching is right at your fingertips here.

The Ngarkat Conservation Park (34 km south of Pinnaroo) is another great option for those who like to rough it. If you don't have a 4WD, a 2WD will still get you to some good spots.

For some seriously good river and lakeside camping, we suggest the Haythorpe and Bolto Reserve in Mannum, Tenbury Hunter Reserve in Swan Reach, Wongulla Campground, and Nurrung Jetty Reserve.

RV-friendly towns

We've got room for what you're hauling. Our Council-owned RV parks have various amenities ranging from toilet dump points, fresh water, and convenient access to local facilities.

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The <u>Coonalpyn Soldiers Memorial Caravan</u> <u>Park</u> is pet friendly and great for keeping families entertained with a BMX track,

swimming pool and playground on-site.

You can find a nice, shady spot next to the Bremer River at the Frank Potts Reserve, located in the heart of the Langhorne Creek Wine Region. See <u>page 22</u> for a great source of additional information, with complete lists of all RV towns and Visitor Information Centres.

Whether you're a stargazer, astrophotographer or simply love the great outdoors, the newly accredited River Murray International Dark Sky Reserve should be on your bucket list.

The 3,200 square kilometre area (some of which falls within the Swan Reach Conservation Park) has some of the

darkest skies in the world. The reserve is the only one of its kind in Australia, and one of only 16 in the world.

Photographers and astronomers travel here from around the world chasing the clearest views to the Milky Way, with darkness measuring

21.97 out of 22 at the reserve's core site – almost complete darkness. Spanning over such a large and diverse space means the reserve has an array of astro hot spots, ideal star viewing areas and tour options available with the teams from <u>Big Bend By Night</u>, Juggle House <u>Experiences</u> and the <u>PS Marion</u>.

With the best time to view during complete darkness, visitors should make the most of their adventure and <u>stay the night</u> in the nearby towns of Swan Reach, Walker Flat, Punyelroo, Cambrai, Sedan, Mannum, Purnong or Caurnamont.

Driving on country roads

What you need to know before you visit

The reserve is about a 90 minute drive from Adelaide, or 10 minutes from Mannum.

You don't need a telescope or fancy stargazing equipment out here. A pair of binoculars will do the trick for beginners. Or just sit back and look up (you might see the International Space Station pass overhead).

If you are a keen stargazer, then bring along your telescope and set yourself up in a quiet, remote area (a full list of sites here <u>themurrayriver.com</u>). Photographers should bring all equipment fully charged (remember, there's no power in the reserve).

If you love camping, then find one of the many spots out in our Conservation Park or local river reserves and soak up the beautiful night sky any time you want.

If you're not an experienced camper, we would suggest an organised tour and overnight accommodation through one of our great local caravan parks, cabins, motels, riverside holiday homes – or a houseboat.
