

We've long been famous for our iconic houseboat holidays and paddlesteamer history, but there's more on offer.

Our waterways begin in the lower Murray near Swan Reach. This stretch boasts some of the River's widest expanses and most spectacular ochre cliff faces - a serene view for your evening wines, or backdrop for your morning paddle. Not to mention, we have some of the darkest skies in the world (and clearest views of the Milky Way).

From here, we follow the Mighty Murray Way towards Mannum and Murray Bridge, two of our larger river towns.

Both have large riverfront recreation areas with restaurants. These idyllic spots are home to major events, and other days they're filled with people soaking up river life. Our idyllic river

In Murray Bridge you can also visit our quirky mythical Bunyip, or for a real-life encounter just head 10 minutes down the road to Monarto Zoo.

From here, we float south towards the Lower Lakes, Murray Mouth and Coorong - one of the most unique environments in the world - made famous again by the 2019 film remake of Storm Boy.

Along the way, you'll go through Tailem Bend, now firmly on the map thanks to The Bend Motorsport Park.

Further south, you'll start catching glimpses of Lake's Albert and Alexandrina, as they begin to open

up to the Coorong National Park. The laid-back town of Meningie is set right on Lake Albert and known for having spectacular sunsets and fresh seafood.

On the other side of the Coorong, you can travel through Lake Alexandrina

towns (such as Milang and Langhorne Creek) on your way to Goolwa, this is where the Murray meets the sea.

Kayaking on the Coorong

Strap your boots on.

One of our region's best features is our mostly flat terrain. This, coupled with our mild winter conditions, means our trails (on and off water) are accessible all year round.

So whether you're an avid paddler, runner, bushwalker or cyclist - you've got places to break a sweat here, no matter the season. Even Monarto Zoo has extensive walking trails, meaning you can have some seriously up-close encounters with the wild, without the crowds.

Our biggest, is the 325 kilometre Lavender Federation Trail, a favourite amongst bushwalkers. It starts in Murray Bridge and winds through diverse countryside. One of the trail highlights runs through Kinchina Conservation Park, just outside of Murray Bridge. This section was upgraded in 2018 and now with the wild. home to trail-running and mountain-biking events (plus it's dog-friendly).

The Mannum Waterfalls are also a great hike for the whole family.



The Lower Murray Canoe Trail was launched early in 2019 and is gaining momentum from some of Australia's paddle community. Created to give people an up-close experience with the Lower Murray ecosystems, this trail offers options for beginner, amateurs and advanced paddlers.

The Mannum Canoe Trail has a history focus, as it shows you a view of the historic PS Marion and Mannum Dock Museum from the water.

If you're after a guided tour to some of our most pristine parts of the Coorong

> (many only accessible by kayak), then Canoe the Coorong is for you. This team can host all ages and abilities. If you prefer to go it alone just hire your own - our local Visitor Information Centres can get you sorted.

Love stand up paddleboarding? Murray Bridge has a section of River, just off Long Island Reserve which is closed to

motorised vehicles. So there's always calm, glassy and protected waters (and native birdlife to keep you company). Our local rowers are out on this stretch most mornings, so keep an eye out for the crews.

The Lower Lakes are shallow and great for any style of paddling (or on the blowy days, they're popular for wind and kite-surfing). If you're a morning person - we'd recommend an early start for the ultimate in flat water sunrise experience.

Peddle power

The Encounter Bikeway begins along the Murray River in Goolwa, and its fully sealed route takes you along the River's edge to the barrage. You'll pedal under the Hindmarsh Bridge and through the wharf precinct. Renowned for its cycling culture, Goolwa cafés will welcome serious and recreational cyclists chasing a cuppa or meal.

Anything goes

Many parts of the exciting new 450 kilometre Murray Coorong Trail are also open. This walking and mountain bike trail takes in some of the most incredible views of the River, Lower Lakes and Coorong, Sections of between 2 and 20 kilometres will take you along various surfaces, across the ferry at Mannum, through native pine forests near Tailem Bend, along the riverside at Wellington and take you from the Meningie township to the edge of the Coorong. You can also hire bikes and kayaks along the route, so no panic if you left yours at home.

Some shorter trails to explore include the Tailem Bend History Trail or Murray Bridge Discovery Trail. Or for riverside views and native wildlife, why not try the Pelican Path in Meningie, Swanport and Rocky Gully wetlands in Murray Bridge. Or try the Goolwa Barrage walk which takes in spectacular views of the Murray Mouth.



Other popular cellar doors are Lake Breeze, with its second-storey picturesque vineyard views from the deck. Plus Kimbolton - with their architecturally-designed cellar door and cheese and wine flights.

You can also indulge at Meechi Brewing - part of <u>The Winehouse</u> - a restaurant. cellar door and brewery.

In Murray Bridge, we've also got retro café The Davery Establishment dishing up some of the region's best brunch and coffee. These guys are a favourite amongst locals, with unique daily specials.

Heading south to

Tailem Bend, you should try <u>Little</u> Local Co's coffee, and if you're on the highway, you can't go past Coonalpyn without indulging in the waffles.

In Meningie you can pick up a fresh Coorong Mullet sandwich, but for an immersive experience, get in touch with the crew from Coorong Wild Seafood to try their unique Catch and Eat Tour.

Over in Mannum, The Pretoria Hotel's front deck sits you on the River's edge; and towards the Murray Mouth in Goolwa, the wharf precinct is bustling with cafés, a gin distillery and Sunday markets.


Speed up



Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone

Restrictions apply for bringing fresh fruit and vegetables into the region, unless purchased within SA and accompanied by a valid receipt. You must eat or properly dispose of produce at quarantine station bins before travelling through the Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone.

You should not bring any fruit or vegetables across the state border into SA unless they comply with state regulations (produce with receipts are ineligible). Fines of up to \$100,000 may apply. Visit the PIRSA website for guidelines.

Big Bend by Night, Swan Reach

Feed a lion, bid on a sheep race, learn how to fillet fish, or simply immerse yourself in some of the most beautiful bird sanctuaries on the planet.

It seems that whatever sort of wild adventure your heart craves, our region will have something to fulfil it. Monarto Zoo is one of our most prominent icons, and people travel from across the globe to try out the latest animal experiences.

The award-winning Lions 360 encounter allows people a once-in-a-lifetime experience, including hand-feeding the lion pride. Or if it's a gentler family experience you crave, why not meander with the meerkats or feed the giraffes.





Near Swan Reach lies a little-known nocturnal adventure known as <u>Big Bend By Night</u>. These guys live and breathe the outback,

and a few hours spent with them, will see you petting kangaroos, watching a live sheep race, and exploring wombat holes after dark. You can even enjoy a bushtucker

breakfast on the banks of one of the most immaculate stretches of the Murray River cliffs.

If seafood is more your style, then head to the Coorong for a stay. Here, you'll be treated to some of the most spectacular birdlife you'll ever see (pack your binoculars), plus the Coorong National Park is home to plenty of Oz's best - including emus, kangaroos, wombats, echidnas. Coorong mullet has become pretty famous down this way, and none more so, than with fisherman Glen Hill (better known as the 'Wild Man of the Coorong'). Glen is one half of Coorong Wild Seafood, the team now delivering a unique 'catch and eat' experience from Meningie.

Switch off, and get back to nature

Our spectacular waterways, dark skies and unique land are some of our greatest assets. Our backyard is the perfect place to switch off the phone and immerse yourself in nature.

From a morning sunrise across the Murray, to sunset views over the Lakes - and even once the sky is dark (and

> we mean really dark) we still have some of the best views in the world. During the day, you can explore conservation areas, wetlands and national parks. At night time, you can watch the stars and

Milky Way clearer than anywhere else in the State! In fact, the Mid Murray district has been measured as having some of the darkest skies in the world. So whether your perfect weekend away is a camping trip under the stars, or you're a budding astronomy photographer, this should be a bucket list location.

Camping, bushwalking, mountain biking, fishing, four-wheel-driving and kayaking all work together here. Every day we see four-wheel-drives loaded up with everything they need for the ultimate camping and off-road adventure.

Start at the freshwater end, camping along the banks of Swan Reach or Walker Flat, before you head along the Mighty Murray Way towards campsites at Mannum and Murray Bridge.

From here, you can shoot down to the unique edges of the Lower Lakes and Coorong for a saltier experience. No matter where you decide to explore though, you'll feel a million miles away from civilisation.

If you love fishing, our region is perfect too, because you can catch a giant mulloway or even a fresh callop without having to board a boat!

Twitch, twitch

Twitchers love the region for its incredible variety of birdlife and conservation areas. Of course the gem of the region is the Jack's Point Pelican Observatory down near Salt Creek in the Coorong, but there is much more.

Just recently, the almost-extinct Mallee Emu Wren was released back in to Ngarkat Conservation Park near Tintinara, and is flourishing (bring your binoculars to capture a glimpse of these tiny beauties). At the other end of our region, we have the Lower Murray backwaters and lagoons which are home to a variety of ducks, herons and bitterns - with a few favourites being black-eared miners, regent parrots, red-lored whistlers, chestnut qual-thrushes, crested bellbirds, whitebrowed treecreepers, hooded robins and more. Places to view these birds include hides at Mannum (Hermann Gass Reserve) Goolwa and Murray Bridge (Riverglades and Swanport Wetlands).


