
South Australian Riverland Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone

Fruit or fruiting vegetables may only travel into South Australia's Riverland Fruit Fly Exclusion Zone if they have been purchased in SA and are travelling with an itemised receipt, or if they are accompanied by a current Plant Health Certificate.

Travelling within SA?

South Australian quarantine checkpoints

Quarantine stations and fruit disposal bins are strategically placed throughout South Australia. Random quarantine roadblocks can operate anytime and anywhere within the state. Anyone caught bringing fruit illegally into South Australia or the Riverland will face fines and penalties.

Visiting a vineyard?

Help keep South Australia's premium wine regions phylloxera free. Grapes, grapevines and associated products are prohibited from entering South Australia. For more information visit www.vinehealth.com.au

Providing proof

When travelling either into South Australia or within the state, proof may be required to show the item you are carrying is from a state which is free of a particular pest or disease. Declarations and forms are available at www.pir.sa.gov.au/biosecurity/plant_health

Riverland

Do not take fresh unprocessed fruit and fruiting vegetables (including capsicum, chilli, tomato and eggplant) into the Riverland region without an itemised receipt from a South Australian retail outlet or a Plant Health Certificate.

Kangaroo Island

Do not take rabbits, bees or bee products onto the island. Potatoes are also prohibited unless they have been washed or brushed free of soil and are in new packaging.
